

Florence County Forestry & Parks Campgrounds

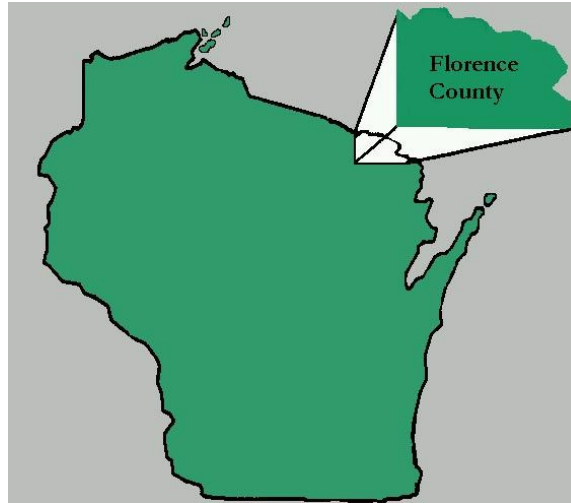
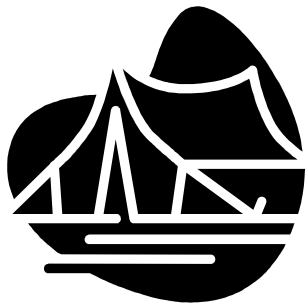
Lake Emily Park– Commonwealth– off of County Hwy D- Sandy bottom beach, boat launch, fishing, 18 electric sites, water pumps, picnic tables, grills, bathhouses and pit toilets. \$15 electric.

West Bass Lake Park– Homestead– off of County Hwy C– Sandy beach, boat launch, 15 rustic sites with water pumps, picnic tables, grills, bathhouses and pit toilets. \$8 rustic.

All County campgrounds are available on a first come first serve basis. You can also camp anywhere on the County Forest. More information can be obtained by calling the Forestry and Parks office at 715-528-3207 or www.florencewisconsin.com

Private Campgrounds

Keyes Lake Campground– Keyes Lake Campground & Mini Golf - Located on HWY 101- Features: electric and water hookups, electric, tent sites, Cabins, flush toilets, showers, dump station, Laundromat, convenience store, LP Gas Filling, Bait & Tackle, and fish freezing service. 18 hole Mini Golf and swimming at county park and boat ramp. Phone: 715-528-4907. \$16 to \$20 www.keyeslakecampground.com.

Camping in the Clouds– located on US 2/141– 46 total sites. Features: sewer, water, electric hookup, flush toilets, bar, and restaurant. Indoor swimming pool, volleyball, horseshoe pit, tether ball. Adjacent to ATV/snowmobile trail. Phone: 715-528-5596.

Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources

The WI DNR maintains 3 dispersed sites along the Wild Rivers Property that are only accessible from the river. These rustic sites have a picnic table, fire ring and wooden latrine. Call 888-889-0049 for a Wild Rivers guide that shows where these sites are located.

There are 2 rustic sites in the Spread Eagle Barrens State Natural Area. One is off of Fire Lane and the other west of Barrens Lake.

Public Campgrounds

WE Energies Wilderness Shores– located on the north and south sides of the Pine River Flowage, sites #24 and #34 each have 3 wilderness sites. \$9. Closed Sept. 30. 906-779-2519.

Town of Homestead– Campgrounds and parks located at East Bass Lake, Sand Lake, Bush Lake, and Scout lake. Toilets and boat landings. Limited stay of 3 days or less.

National Forest Camping

Lost Lake Campground- 28 family camp units with tent pads, picnic tables, fire rings, vault toilets, and drinking water. Swimming and boat landing. \$12. Open year round.

Chipmunk Rapids Campground– 6 sites featuring an artisan well which flows all year round. Located on Pine River. \$10. Open May 2-Nov 29.

Perch Lake Walk-in Campground– 5 sites and a canoe launch site are 1/4 mile and 1 mile from parking area. Each site has a tent pad, picnic tables, fire ring and wilderness type toilet. There is no drinking water supply. All equipment must be carried in. No fee for camping. Open year round.

National Forest Camping, continued

Lauterman Lake Walk-in Campground– 5 sites, same features as Perch Lake. All sites are between 3/4 to 1 1/2 mile from parking area. No fee for camping. Open year round.

Morgan Lake Campground– 18 sites with tent pads, picnic tables, fire rings, vault toilets, and drinking water. Swimming beach and boat landing. Also features group camping area for up to 25 people– available on a reservation basis. \$10/night for family sites, \$30/night for group sites. Open May 24-Sept 24.

Stevens Lake Campground– Stevens Lake Campground is a fishing oriented campground with 6 units. All 6 units are usually occupied on weekends during the summer. A boat access with ramp, parking, and toilet is adjacent to the campground. Fishing is usually moderate to good for walleye, northern pike, and panfish. The campground lies in a mixed stand of aspen and sugar maple. \$12. Open May 2-Nov 29.

Brule River Campground– This campground is designed for the fishing enthusiast. There are 11 campsites located in a beautiful balsam fir-red pine grove. Although located on a good highway (Hwy 55), it is not a heavily used campground. Carry-in boat access to the river is available. There is no swimming beach provided. \$10. Open May 2 – Oct 3.
